AL WEAVER HONORED

In 2006, Al Weaver received the Barbara Bush Library Friends "Volunteer of the Year" award for contributions he made to the library, especially for managing the Friends used book store. On December 10, 2008, Al received another award – one with a

\$5,000 prize attached. He was the second place winner in the "Recycle Ike" contest which tested the ingenuity and creativity of Houston's residents in devising new ways to recycle the tree debris left behind after the recent hurricane.

The City of Houston insisted that wood debris from Ike not be sent to landfills. Much of it was being chipped for mulch and compost, but there was just too much of it. The idea behind the "Recycle Ike" competition was to generate new ways to use this wood waste.

Al is a retired chemical engineer who worked at Shell Oil. This background served him well in developing his proposal, which involves putting the wood waste into abandoned sand pits around Harris County, covering them, and drawing off the methane gas that would be produced as the wood decays.

African American Read-In Sunday, February 8, 2009

Over a million readers of all ages and ethnic groups across the United States are expected to participate in the twentieth annual African American Read-In. The Barbara Bush Library and the E.B.O.N.Y. organization will join forces as official sponsors of this event locally. The goal is to make the celebration of African American literacy a traditional part of Black History Month activities.

Activities are planned for adults, teens, and children. Authors ReShonda Tate Billingsley, Gwen Richardson, and Oswald Scott are some of the featured guests for this event. Come, discuss, and hear excerpts from their various novels. Some of Ms. Billingsley's titles include Can I get a Witness? and Let the Church Say Amen. Some of her teen books are Nothing But Drama, Blessings in Disguise, and Fair-Weather Friends. Mrs. Richardson is the author of Why African Americans Can't Get Ahead and How We Can Solve it with Group Economics (Richardson) and Mr. Scott has penned The Promise: A Black Man's Guide to Money, Power and Respect.

The session for children will be in the Robin Bush Activity Room. Kathy Culmer, author and storyteller, will be our featured guest for the children. She will tell African and African-American folk tales. There will also be other activities for the children. Ms. Culmer is also the author or a devotional book called Yes, Jesus Loves Me.

Check out some of these books prior to the event so that you may participate in the discussions. Refreshments will be served and books will be on sale by the Barbara Bush Library Friends.

E.B.O.N.Y. (Enrichment and Brotherhood Organization of Northwest Youth) has had a longstanding and mutual relationship with the library. The group was founded to promote unity among neighbors through opportunities for members and their families to learn, teach, and socialize with other community members. "Deep in the forests of the Pacific Northwest, a mill town called Commonwealth votes to quarantine itself in the wake of the 1918 flu pandemic, setting up guards to prevent anyone from coming in or out, but a violent confrontation with a tired, hungry, and cold soldier will have devastating repercussions for the entire town." (Novelist)

January 22, 1:30 p.m. The Afternoon Book Club will discuss Interred With Their Bones by Jennifer Lee On the eve of the Globe's production of Hamlet, Shakespeare scholar and theater director Kate Stanley's eccentric mentor gives her a mysterious box, claiming to have made a groundbreaking discovery. Before she can reveal it to Kate, however, terrifying echoes of the past break through to the present: The Globe burns, and a body is found inside - murdered in the strange manner of Hamlet's father. The current Neighbor to Neighbor program runs from May 1, 2008 to April 20, 2009. Even if you have been a part of this program in the past, you must re-register to continue participating by presenting a letter with **the Barbara Bush Library Friends' barcode (1-0000-80373)** to the cashier upon checkout. You can pick up this letter at the library, or print it out from http://www.krogerneighbortoneighbor.com/pdf/10000080373.pdf

After the cashier has scanned your Kroger Plus Card you will be enrolled for the current year of the Kroger Neighbor to Neighbor Donation Program. Every time you shop at Kroger and use your enrolled Kroger Plus Card, Kroger will contribute a percentage of your eligible purchases to the Kroger Neighbor to Neighbor Donation fund. Once a card is scanned with the barcode, it will be active for the remainder of the program year.



The Randall's program operates somewhat similarly. You can designate an organization to receive your donations at any time by completing a Remarkable Application Form at the Courtesy Booth. Fill in the top portion and the "Good Neighbor Program" section, indicating what account number to link or delink on your card.

The Good Neighbor Number for the Barbara Bush Library Friends is 1362. If you already have a card, ask the cashier to link it to 1362.

Once your Remarkable card is linked to our organization, that's it! Every time you make a purchase using your Remarkable card, your purchase will be automatically credited to the Barbara Bush Library Friends. Current cards are still active, and re-registration is not needed for the Randall's program.


