Record Breaking June

Three times a year, the library system does a count of the patrons coming into the branches during a week's time.

The 2009 count at Barbara Bush was 12,555 visitors within the week of June 14 - June 20. This is the highest count ever recorded at this branch. Last year's count was 11,829, and the count ten years ago when we were still in the old building was 4,453.

The current numbers extrapolate out to more than half a million visitors per year!

"I HAVE A DREAM" Writing Contest Winners Chosen

Harris County Public Library recently participated in the Big Read, a community-wide reading program that focused on the book "To Kill a Mockingbird" by Harper Lee. As part of our local programming related to the Big Read, the Taiwanese Heritage Society and the Barbara Bush Library Friends co-sponsored a writing contest. Artist Yu-Ru Huang designed a mockingbird kite on which participants could write their dreams, and then fly the kite to let their dreams take wings.

Each winner in the writing contest received a certificate and a decorated kite. The six winners at the Barbara Bush Library were:

The top of the kite began with a quote from the famous Martin Luther King speech: "I have a dream that one day this nation will rise up and live out the true meaning of its creed: that all men are created equal. I have a dream today. I have a dream that ..."

Here are excerpts from some of the winning entries:

I have a dream that ... people of all types, body size, color, creed, and intelligence will be seen as acceptable. That we will not be perceived or choose to perceive others as just man or woman, but as human. My dream is that people will cease to negatively judge others because of how they dress, how they speak, whom they love, their religious views, or their gender identity and presentation, but instead, consider them as an equal and beautiful human life.

I have a dream that ... my true feelings shall be expressed through canvas and paint, and everyone will understand what story is planned to be told to the world from the point of view of a child growing up in the United States.

I have a dream that ... our nation will rise to the occasion and seize the opportunity given by the waiting hands of our neighbors. To overlook this great, looming hand is to be of great ignorance, for it is there waiting for us to reach out and grasp it. To then clasp the poor and guilty's shoulders, so that in the end, all souls can drift towards happiness and virtue. I have a dream that we will come to realize that, yes, our eyes were created to see above the surface, but minds were created also, to join with the eyes and create a more powerful vision of what is underneath.

I have a dream that ... this dream of peace will come true and our troops will come home. When this happens, I dream that we will have no more enemies, only friends.

Book totes will be available for purchase at the Circulation Service Desk.








Wednesday, July 1, 1:30 p.m.

There will be a 75th Anniversary screening of the classic 1934 black and white movie version of






Time Twisters Teen Summer Reading Program

Customer Letter

Step One:

Read through this letter to understand the advantage of being a part of the Kroger Neighbor to Neighbor Donation Program.

Step Two:

Take the letter with you to your neighborhood Kroger store the next time you go shopping.

Step Three:

Present the letter with **your organization's barcode** to your cashier upon checkout. After they have scanned your Kroger *Plus* Card you will be enrolled for the current year of the Kroger Neighbor to Neighbor Donation Program. Every time you shop at Kroger and use your enrolled Kroger *Plus* Card, Kroger will contribute a percentage of your eligible purchases to the Kroger Neighbor to Neighbor Donation fund. Once a card is scanned with the barcode, it will be active for the remainder of the program year.

Q & A

How many Kroger Neighbor to Neighbor accounts can an organization have?

One bar code per organization. (Example: ABC HIGH SCHOOL account could represent: PTA, cheerleaders, football, basketball, band, etc. Unless they can provide a copy of their 501(c)(3) letter for their organization.)

Can a household "link" their Kroger Plus Card to more than one organization at a time?

No, the system allows for one organization per household. To change organizations, you must present your Kroger *Plus* Card and the new organization's barcode to the cashier.

How much can my organization earn?

The Kroger Neighbor to Neighbor Donation Program will donate \$1 million annually. Each organization will earn a portion of the \$1 million equal to the percentage of total earned contributions attributable to that organization.

How are the funds distributed and when?

Contributions will be paid **annually** via check in mid May 2010 and mailed to the organization's address and primary contact identified on the organization application form. For schools, it will be mailed to the principal and the funds distributed at their discretion.

All organization's and participants must re-enroll each new program year.
