The Big Read, an initiative of the National Endowment for the Arts, is a community-wide reading program that will take place in May 2009. We invite everyone in the Harris County metro area to read Harper Lee's *To Kill a Mockingbird* and discuss it with friends and family.

ELIGIBILITY: The contest is open to people who participate in the Big Read Texas 2009 events.

Deadline: May 31, 2009

Procedures:

First, read To Kill a Mockingbird.

Second, reflect on the speech of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. "I Have a Dream".

Third, write your words after "I have a dream that . . ." on the mockingbird sheet.

Fourth, submit the sheet with your contact information to the participating group. Winners will be chosen from each of the participating groups, and announced in June 2009 Each winner will receive a predecorated kite, a kite made by an award-winning kite artist, and a certificate.

All submissions will be included in the next public presentation of the "Echoes of Languages"* project.

This event is sponsored by The Taiwanese Heritage Society of Houston, in partnership with the Harris County Public Library, Bellaire City Library, Brazoria County Library, and the Barbara Bush Library Friends.*Echoes of Languages" is an ongoing and collaborative art project, funded in part by a grant from Harris County through the Cultural Arts Council of Houston/Harris County in 2006.



Check Morningstar, the top name in mutual funds investment information services, which covers both stocks and mutual funds. The library has both print and online subscriptions. Barbara Bush Library Awarded Two Grants

The National Endowment for the Humanities has selected the library to receive the 2009 "We the People: Picturing America" bookshelf grant. As a recipient, the library will receive a set of nineteen hardcover books for the collection. "Picturing America" is inspired by the premise that a nation's literature,

as well as its visual art, can be a window into its history, aspirations, and ideals. The books are a literary complement to the NEH Picturing America set of visual resources that the library received last year, including reproductions of 40 works of great American art. More information will be coming as the library staff prepares displays and programming around these materials in the fall.

The second grant is for \$1100 from the North Harris County Branch of the American Association of University Women to fund a project called "Reaching Early Readers." These funds will be used to purchase phonics materials to help parents of children learning to read, early readers, and ESL students. Materials will include books, book sets, book and CD kits, CD's and DVD's.

We appreciate the support of these dedicated organizations in helping us fulfill the mission of the Harris County Public Library: "to provide information and resources to enrich lives and strengthen communities through innovative services within and beyond our walls."


Author Visit Raymond Benson May 21, 7 p.m.

Mr. Raymond Benson will talk about the history of "007". Mr. Benson is the official James Bond continuation novel author. He will present a slideshow all about the history of 007. It will cover the life of lan

Fleming who originally created the character of James Bond, the rise of 007 in popularity through novels and films, and finally end with Mr. Benson's

own involvement in the franchise. From 1996 through 2002, Raymond wrote Benson and published worldwide Six original Bond novels, three novelizations. and three short stories. Since then, he has been writing his own suspense thrillers.

Mr. Benson is a film historian and currently teachs Film History at the College of DuPage in Glen Ellyn, Illinois. He presents with Chicago film critic Dann Gire a series of live

Author Visit Charles Shields May 7, 4 p.m.

The Harris County Public Library has received a grant from the National Endowment of the Arts to present the Big Read in the metropolitan Houston area. The Big Read is a communitywide reading program. People from all walks of life, including middle and



high school students, are encouraged to read and discuss important issues raised by a single book. This year's selection is "To Kill a Mockingbird", the Pulitzer Prize-winning classic by Harper Lee.

One of the programs sponsored by this grant is a presentation by author Charles Shields who wrote the biography of the very private Harper Lee called "Mockingbird." Mr. Shields will discuss the surprises he encountered while writing the book, including Miss Lee's efforts to discourage friends from speaking with him; the parallels between "To Kill a Mockingbird" and Miss Lee's life; and the reasons why she never published a second book.

The presentation is hosted by the Barbara Bush Library Friends in the Forum of the Cypress Creek Christian Community Center across from the library. Mr. Shields will respond to questions after his presentation. The Barbara Bush Library Friends will have his books available for purchase and signing by Mr. Shields.
